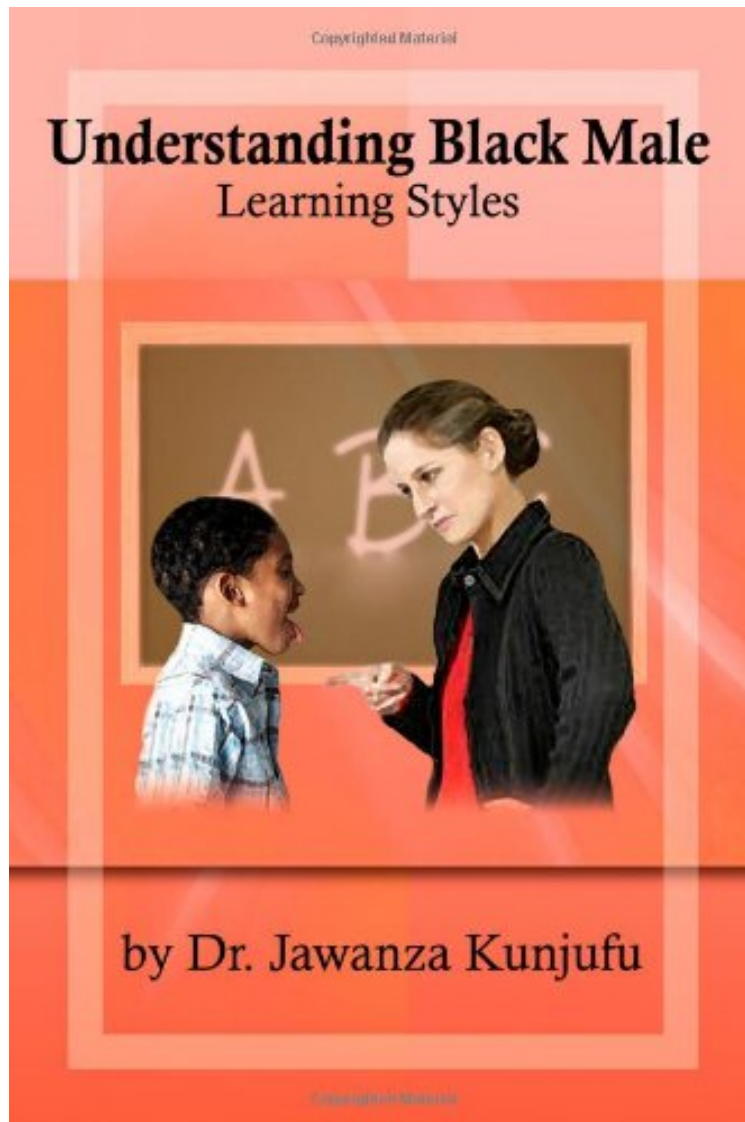

When we're doing homework and I have to explain concepts, I pull out my large post-it note paper along with the colored markers and get to jotting ideas to help them understand. I also make sure to act silly and animated and encourage them to participate by making gestures or

sounds to help emphasize points. Staying active is key in making learning fun and effective. I have also bought a copy for one of my son's teachers. Once she started reading the book, she thanked me for sharing the knowledge. I plan to continue spreading the knowledge to my son's teachers and administrators. The information is very insightful. I grew up in a household with all females in the house and had no idea why boys were so different.
