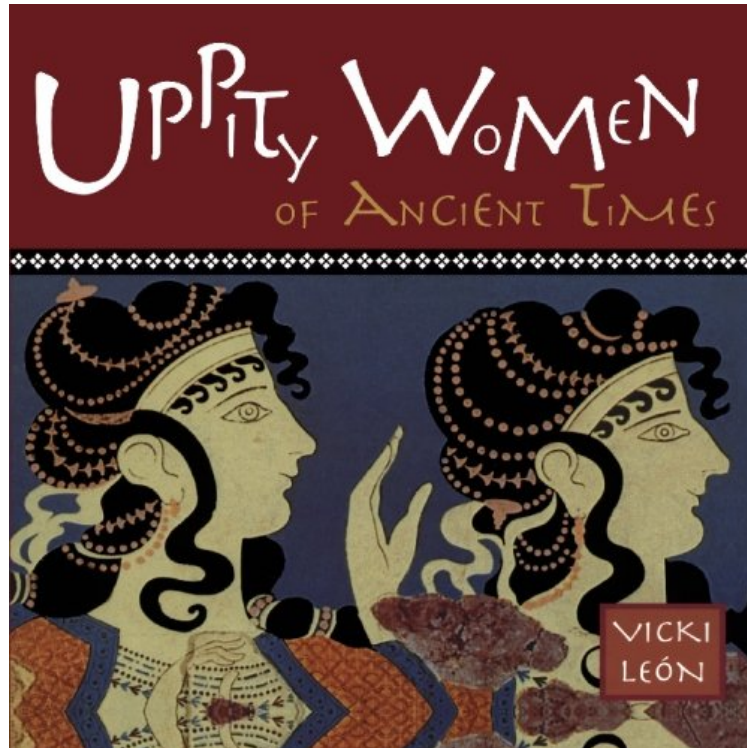

An amusing look at women who lived long ago By Andorrac Does a good job of showing that women of ancient times (in the Mediterranean area) were perfectly capable of coping with life, could do all kinds of things, and achieve fame, and were not the isolated, downtrodden housewives so many people assume falsely that they were. In reality, ancient women were more equal partners in many ways than most western women have been until quite recently, and the downtrodden menials of those times (male and female) were slaves. I do not recall that Leon makes that point, preferring to show how marvelous it was that so many women were able to do what they did. Bates This is my favorite of the entire Uppity Women series. Although the Bible and historians don't tell us much about women in ancient times, the author has found out a lot about them. She has done a thorough job of researching her subjects' stories and the history surrounding them, and gives us delightful "dirt" as well as making her readers realize how important and powerful women have always been. I own the entire series, and often go back and read about some

of the women who were important in their lifetimes, but often totally neglected by historians. These are not dry historical essays. The women really come to life in Vicki Leon's writings.

Uppity Women of Ancient Times presents 200 uproarious pirates, pyramid builders, poets, poisoners, panderers, power brokers, and princesses in a lively, informative, and highly entertaining chronicle of life as it really was. Full of piquant details on sex, sports, madness, celebrities, gossip, and gore, Uppity Women of Ancient Times excavates a myriad of little-known facts about biblical babes, classical consorts, and Mesopotamian maids for the armchair archaeologist in all of us.
